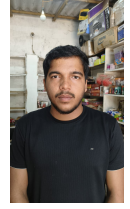

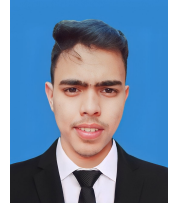

Candidates arriving after the examination starts will not be admitted except with special permission of the Centre Superintendent. This permission in no case will be given to candidate who is more than half an hour late.
4. No book or printed paper or manuscripts other than admit card should be taken into the Examination Hall. A candidate shall not be allowed to consult any book or paper, printed or manuscript, during examination hours either inside or outside the hall.
5. Candidates are not allowed to leave the hall until an hour after an examination starts. They should not leave their seats until they have submitted their answer book to an invigilator.
